Prent Baja Focuses on Quality and Safety

Prent Baja employees have kept busy with training, audits, quality assurance, safety, and production since opening in 2019. Below is the Prent Baja team and a few highlights from this year:



Prent Baja completed its annual, external ISO audit by the ABS Group in May. The audit had very satisfactory results and confirmed consistency in Prent's adherence to ISO-13485 standards. Prent Baja's entire team is committed to ensuring the best quality management system and risk mitigation practices.



As part of its ongoing safety program, Prent Baja performed its annual evacuation drill program in June with a record time of 1.5 minutes.



Prent and GOEX Collaborate to Combat Resin Shortage

A perfect storm came together this past year to create a resin shortage that impacted the plastics industry around the globe—from a crippling southern freeze to high consumer demand that rebounded after the start of the pandemic, all while businesses were still trying to recover from damaging, back-to-back hurricanes. This led to a supply shortfall of raw materials and caused an increase in pricing for plastic resins, making it challenging to secure supplies and fulfill orders.

The freeze in Texas devastated the power grid which played a big part in the material shortage. The last time that Texas had a comparable freeze was 1989 when the state's power grid served less than 17 million people compared to 30 million today!

"We often deal with hurricanes, floods, and droughts that can negatively impact river traffic from the Gulf and inland logistics, but this is the first time that many plastic resin feed stocks were shut down due to a natural disaster," says GOEX Janesville's Director of Materials Bob Merrick.

"When the storm hit, the entire North American petrochemical industry, from which the majority of plastics are derived, shut down. Supplies were short and allocated on a producer level, so GOEX was only able to get a certain percentage of materials based on each producer's situation," Merrick said. "Fortunately, GOEX created a supply chain over the years that allowed it to react quickly to the shortage."

Additionally, GOEX stocks many alternate resins that Prent could access and offer to its medical industry customers for validation to keep production moving as efficiently as possible. According to Merrick, the tremendous synergy between the teams at Prent and GOEX helped Prent's medical industry customers, who traditionally only approve one resin for their packaging, get regulatory approval as quickly as possible.

"Prent was able to work with customers on an as-needed basis to get alternative resins approved through GOEX and keep the supply moving to prevent a stock out. Several of Prent's customers were able to approve alternatives in two weeks. Because we had multiple sources, we were able to tap in to existing resins approved through GOEX," Merrick said.

Merrick said that North America stopped exports of most plastics which helped prevent stock outs across the domestic supply chain. "Supplies are still tight, but dual source resins remain a great option for customers."

I am pleased to report that Prent completed another successful fiscal year—even under the pandemic's cloud. Our human resources department and plant managers arranged vaccination clinics on site, and off site for our smaller facilities, which allowed the majority of our employees to get vaccinated and eliminated the need for face masks/shields. Many of our customers don't yet allow outside visitors, which has created a challenge moving new projects along in some cases.

We completed a new thermoforming cleanroom in Janesville to reduce lead times for ongoing business. And, we've put forth an enormous effort to ensure all Prent facilities worldwide are equivalent—with identical machines—eliminating the need for long validation processes to move business to regional sites as the market changes.

All of Prent's facilities had record sales this past year. China had success in both local medical packaging supply and the computer/ high tech markets. Malaysia had a strong year supplying the computer chip industry, which was in high demand, and medical markets. Our Latin American group (Puerto Rico, Costa Rica, and Mexico) finished strong as elective surgeries continue to increase. Janesville and Flagstaff had to overcome a slower start, but finished very strong in the medical device markets. I want to congratulate our entire staff for finding a way to finish the fiscal year in record form. There was a great sacrifice on everyone's part to keep our momentum going strong over the past year.

We continue to plan for our fiscal 2022, which has record growth in the forecast. We will be busy building machines for additional capacities and plant expansions to better serve our customers. I believe we've assembled the best team in the industry to meet our ever-changing customer requirements.



Retainers Offer a Wide Variety of Benefits

Retainers are an additional component to an overall packaging system that Prent uses to protect fragile medical device components during transit, says Vice President of Product Development Chris Bladl.

Prent has used retainers in its medical device packaging for decades. "Not only are retainers a protective part of the package, but they also serve as a useful component in the presentation of a device, providing more functionality to the end user," Bladl says.

Some common types of retainers that Prent uses, depending on the design intent for the customer and the device, include:

- Drop In
- Snap In
- Hinged (pictured above)
- Permanent
- Removable

Key features of a retainer include rapid loading of a product, easy end-user access to a tray, and excellent sterilization presentation. Retainers also are beneficial in medical device packaging because they:

- Enhance product protection
- Reduce sterile barrier tray complexity
- Offer better ergonomics for the end user than undercut retention features in the tray
- Enhance the aseptic transfer of a medical device into the sterile field in many scenarios

Prent's Newly Patented Retainer

"Currently, every Prent retainer is custom designed for each package," Bladl said. "However, we are working on a standard retainer in several different sizes that we will house in a design library so our designers can select from a standard retainer for many products."

"Prent is in the process of patenting this new "pretainer" that will standardize small twist-to-open and slide-to-open retainers that can be implemented into any medical device package, allowing for maximum product protection during shipment. They also can be easily disengaged, providing smooth aseptic transfer to the sterile field while improving the ergonomics of this process," Bladl said.

Prent Offers COVID-19 Vaccines to Staff

Prent employees, and even some family members, took advantage of free COVID-19 vaccinations around the globe

The health and safety of all Prent Corporation employees and customers remains a high priority. Thus, Prent encouraged its employees around the globe to get vaccinated for COVID-19 as vaccines became available.

Prent Janesville

Prent Janesville plans to hold another vaccination clinic in the fall in conjunction with its on-site influenza vaccination clinic.

Prent China

While authorities in China have been doing an excellent job of containing the COVID-19 virus, they are determined to achieve an 80%+ vaccination rate before accepting regular visits into and out of China again.



Prent Malaysia

Prent Malaysia applied to participate in the government-sponsored Industry Vaccination Program in June and was one of the first to receive approval due its affiliation with the medical sector. 94% of Prent Malaysia's staff received its first dose on July 11 and will receive its second dose August 1.



Prent Baja

The Mexican government distributed 1.3 million doses of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine at Mexico's northern border this summer. In an effort to promote a safe work environment, Prent Baja sent all of its employees to get vaccinated as soon as the vaccination program was launched.



Prent Puerto Rico

In the midst of a very high demand and low supply of COVID-19 vaccines in Puerto Rico, Prent Puerto Rico was able to coordinate and secure sufficient Moderna vaccines for all of its employees. Vaccination clinics were held on April 5 and 29. After all first responders and residents at high risk received vaccinations in Puerto Rico, the government allowed critical manufacturers like Prent to have their employees vaccinated.

Prent Costa Rica

Prent Costa Rica is one of the few Latin American countries that had a contract with manufacturers to obtain COVID vaccines; however, the government-run initiative has been slow. Most of those at high risk were vaccinated first, and teachers will be next, followed by the general public. Officials are hoping around 70% of the population will be vaccinated by September 2021.

Prent Promotes Sustainability During COVID

Prent's commitment to environmental sustainability has remained a constant—even throughout the pandemic this past year, according to Prent Janesville's Facilities Engineer Luke Forde.

Prent proactively manages the output of its equipment, which is tied into a Business Management System (BMS), to ensure everything operates as it should. "Our heating and cooling systems and utilities are run on the BMS which allows us to access diagnostics and historic data of our HVAC, process chilled water, hot water, air compressors, vacuum pumps, and other units at all times—onsite and remotely."

"We can track historic data that is recorded every two minutes for the equipment that is tied into the BMS. That allows us to view trends on how effectively things are running and proactively change it to run more efficiently. For example, we can go back in time to see if a certain system is running hotter or more often than previous load history to determine if we have an issue downstream, and we can then track down the problem and fix it. The BMS is also tied into an alarm system that alerts us via email and text when problems arise in real time, so we are able to quickly acknowledge issues and get ahead of them," Forde says. Prent continues to add equipment to the system to increase efficiency.

"Additionally, due to social distancing and air quality provisions in the work place during the pandemic, we were able to increase our air flow to have more air changes per hour." This helped mitigate the potential for the COVID virus to circulate in less stagnant air, according to Forde.
