The Mexican plant fulfills Prent's mission to be a strategic global supplier, serving medical device clusters in the Baja California Region, with its initial customers in the Tijuana, Rosarito, Ensenada, Mexicali and Tecate areas. And, Prent Baja is quickly expanding to serve other regions of Mexico and the California area.

"Prent Baja has received product transfers from other facilities and, to benefit from our local sourcing advantage, is supporting an accelerated market share growth leading the expansion," says Cesar Sandoval, Prent Baja Plant Manager.

Prent Baja has a state-of-the-art ISO Class 8 certified cleanroom that houses Prent designed and built thermoforming machines with ample space for more machines, including a new thermoformer in progress, to accommodate the rapid growth. Prent's returnable tote program, free freight to Prent's local customers, and supply strategies like JIT, Kanban, and VMI are Prent trademarks featured at this facility, says Sandoval.

Prent Baja's local employees trained at other Prent facilities to help ensure consistent, high-quality performance while lowering customer risk and simplifying tool transfers. Prent Sells Protective Face Shields to the Public

The disposable face shields that Prent designed, produced, and donated to area medical professionals and first responders around the globe earlier this spring are now available to the general public for purchase at both **pcfaceshield.com** and **amazon.com**.

The easy-to-assemble foam and headband face shields are made in the US, contain recycled plastic, are designed to firmly stay in position during use, and allow for easy replacement as needed.

The optically clear shields are equipped with anti-scratch masking (to be removed prior to use) and can be ordered in different quantities. Orders placed at pcfaceshield.com are currently fulfilled and shipped within 24 hours.

These face shields are provided as Good Samaritan goods in response to urgent COVID-19 needs under the EUA and are intended to protect against splash and splatter of liquids, and droplet protection.

Q: What kind of visits are allowed at Prent facilities right now?

A: Prent has reduced our customer visits, but are still accepting visitors and have extensive precautions in place in order to do so safely. All visits must be scheduled and visitors must follow the same steps as our employees. They must wear a face mask at all times and have their temperatures taken upon entry. Our conference rooms are posted at half capacity so we have been utilizing our larger conference rooms to accommodate this safety measure. We have also had great success with virtual meetings with customers and suppliers.

According to Mark Talabac, Prent's Vice President of International Sales and Marketing, CP500 was a collaboration between GOEX and Prent to introduce a cost-effective, alternative material to the medical market place.

CP500 is formulated as an A/B/A co-extruded material. The 'A' layers are made with PETG 6763, a widely recognized standard material for medical packaging. The PETG skins improve impact strength and helps the material seal securely with traditional lid stock. The core layer (or 'B' layer) is high performance medical grade PET that lowers the overall material cost.

"There is constant pressure from medical device companies to find cost savings in the packaging category," says Talabac. "CP500 is a perfect drop-in solution to PETG that can offer anywhere from 10% to 20% cost savings."

CP500 is FDA and USP Class VI compliant, and was formulated without tallow to meet REACH/RoHS regulations. Laboratory testing shows CP500 material to be more ductile, have a higher maximum load, and deflects further to rupture than PETG 6763. In addition, CP500 offers customers these benefits:

- · Lower-cost alternative to popular legacy materials
- · Processes similar to traditional polyester materials
- Product is only in contact with the PETG 6763 outer skins
- Proven sealing parameters allow packaging to seal securely with traditional lid stock
- Same high clarity as conventional polyester materials

Pandemic Q&A: How Prent Successfully Adapted its Operations During COVID-19

Rachel Andres, Prent's Vice President of Manufacturing, reflects on how Prent has successfully and safely maintained production during the pandemic.

Q: How has Prent been able to keep production running so seamlessly during the pandemic?

A: Prent implemented alternative shifts immediately to maximize capacity and we set up a half-hour gap between first and second shifts to reduce the risk of viral exposure between our employees.

Q: What operational adaptations has Prent incorporated during the interim that will continue?

A: Prent made our documentation practices much more intricate and seamless, since our teams are not able to meet face-to-face. Our communication has improved as a result, so we will continue to utilize these practices even once we can meet in person again.

Q: How is Prent managing the tracking systems and taking precautions to keep the workplace safe?

A: We've implemented infrared digital temperature scanners at entry points to Prent facilities and do not

allow employees to enter unless their temperatures read in the normal range and they are asymptomatic.

Q: How has staff adjusted to the new normal?

A: Our employees are thankful that Prent is keeping them safe and taking all these precautions ... they know we care! They are appreciative for the most part; there will always be those who will object to change, but the majority see the steps we are taking and realize it's for everyone's safety. Prent Lead Quality Associate Jessica Kieliszewski agrees, saying "We are grateful that, with all the craziness going on in the world today, Prent has taken all the precautions possible to make us feel safe with the new normal and that we are able to continue working when many are not."

Q: How has communication changed with customers and suppliers during the pandemic?

A: We have utilized all things virtual and the process is seamless. We use Zoom meetings and electronic sales presentations and have had great success in doing so while remaining safe. *(continued inside)*

Prent Builds New Cleanroom in Janesville

Prent Janesville is building a new 8,000 square-foot Class 8 cleanroom that will match the existing six Class 8 cleanrooms currently in use in Janesville. Scheduled for completion in January 2021, the cleanroom will allow for growth in Prent's Wisconsin operations and provide even more manufacturing capacity in addition to the existing cleanrooms currently in use in Janesville.

Prent continues to upgrade its existing production spaces into Class 8 cleanrooms throughout North America, according to Mark Rothlisberger, Senior Vice President of Manufacturing at Prent's headquarters in Janesville.

"As Prent continues to grow, we had a need to build additional production capacity. Our Janesville headquarters is our center of best practice, so it makes sense to add more capacity to this facility," Rothlisberger said.

Future growth could lead to construction of additional cleanrooms at other Prent facilities, according to Rothlisberger. "Prent continually reviews its capacities and is prepared to invest in additional equipment and manufacturing cleanroom space wherever it is appropriate. The addition of this new cleanroom will allow Prent to continue to provide the timely service that our customers have come to expect of us."
